Estate of Stevic v. Bio-medical Applications of Ohio, Inc., d/b/a FMC Dialysis Services of Richland County, The Supreme Court of Ohio. Argued in favor of a broader interpretation of “medical claim” under the tort reform statute (2008)

Thompson v. THC, Inc. et al. United States District Court, Southern District of Ohio. Suit, filed by the resident’s son, alleged improper discharge of the resident from a skilled nursing facility because the resident had not received 100 days of skilled care as allowed by Medicare (2008).

Kobler v. Royal Oak Nursing and Rehabilitation Center, Common Pleas Court for Cuyahoga County, Ohio. Suit alleged nursing home negligence and a violation of the nursing home bill of rights statute (2008).

Chromic v. Kaiser Permanente, et al. Court of Appeals for the Eighth Appellate District, Cuyahoga County, Ohio. Cause of action dismissed due to Plaintiff’s failure to file an affidavit of merit in a refiled cause of action for medical malpractice (2007)
